# Hints Forge (Kevin Caine)

John Martin from Warwickshire emailed the village website with information about his family's connection with Hints forge. His paternal line were all iron/steel workers and he believes Edward senior worked at Hints Forge which he understands closed in the 1760's. John and his wife visited St. Bartholomew's churchyard last Autumn but whilst the records which are available on our website record several burials, they could not find any graves for "Martin". The history of these forges at that time was that they opened and closed after several decades and the forgeman would move. They did not use coal which was more sustainable, until about 1765-1780 so until that time as production increased they would tend to use up all the wood from the surrounding countryside and then they became uneconomic and closed when the price of iron, which tended to be cyclical (as now), fell. If anyone has any other info on the Hints forge or the Martin family he would love to know.
