## Bird Update (Janet Clarke)

Our hen pheasant successfully hatched around twelve eggs in the most stupid of places - next to the children's play area and car park fence!! The nest was very well hidden. Some of the chicks found their way into the sand pit and were carried very gently by concerned youngsters up to the cabin staff who returned them to the nest. The chicks are no bigger than a golf ball. Early on the morning of Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> July Roy checked the nest and found all empty eggshells and no sign of the mother and babies. Later that morning a child found one chick, again in the sand pit, who had been left behind. Roy spent quite a while trying to locate the mother and he was able to return this lost baby to the rest of the brood. Unfortunately, after much searching, we have not seen any further sign of the babies. Hen pheasants are notoriously bad mothers and having sat on those eggs for three weeks and successfully hatched them it all seems such a waste of time and effort on her part! That's nature for you. The bird song from all our resident birds has diminished - they are probably moulting and until they acquire their new feathers they keep a low profile. We could do with an automatic water supply to the birdbath; when there are six or seven starlings in it at one time, the water soon vanishes.

PS from June Northway – there were 2 green woodpeckers on her lawn and in the trees for about half an hour.

## Garden Guild (Maureen Casson)


