# Parish Council (Geoff Kynaston)

At the Parish Council meeting on 14<sup>th</sup> July, our clerk, Paulette Ross handed in her resignation. We are now looking for a replacement clerk. Full details will be placed on the web site when available. Local resident, Jess Ross, attended the meeting to offer to enquire about a defibrillator for the village hall. In the meantime the Parish Council will be investigating various sources of grant funding for defibrillators for both village halls. Highways have been and investigated the potholes in Rookery Lane and we are now awaiting their action. It would appear that they consider it a category 3 problem, which could take up to 90 days to be addressed. Racing motorbikes on a Tuesday night have become an issue in Hints Village. Councillor Clarke has contacted the local police who are arranging for a mobile camera to be present on a Tuesday night. If anyone needs to contact the police for non-emergencies, you are reminded that they can be contacted on 101. A new management committee has been set up for a further twelve months to maintain the Parish Field in Canwell. Residents are reminded that it is situated behind the old school in Slade Lane and that there is off road parking at the rear of the houses in Old London Road. Access is from Slade Lane immediately behind the school-parking bay. The banning of right hand turns out of Slade Lane onto Sutton Road has been removed from Staffordshire County Councils web site. We hope that they are reconsidering their options and come up with a proposal that would be more acceptable to the majority of road users.
