# Parish Council (Geoff Kynaston)

At the last Parish Council meeting concerns were raised about the speed of traffic in Slade Road around the London Road junction and the school. Staffordshire county council have been asked to look into the problem and make some suggestions on traffic calming in this area. A public meeting was arranged in Quinney Hall on Thursday the 17<sup>th</sup> Nov by residents to discuss the "no right turn on the A453/Slade Road Junction". It was well supported by over 133 in attendance. Only one Staffordshire Highways representative was in attendance and he was surprised by the number of people who turned up. There was another serious accident on Sat 19<sup>th</sup> involving all three emergency services. Highways are to revisit this problem in January and we hope that they will redesign the junction to improve safety.
