It's wonderful to see great numbers of birds visiting our feeders again. The seed and nut bills have risen sharply but they are all worth it. We have lots of blue tits at all the feeders, along with chaffinches, robins, gold and green finches and the woodpecker makes an occasional appearance. He is the one visitor who discards more seeds than any of the other birds, so the pigeon waiting patiently below benefits greatly and he is so fat that he can only waddle around. We have a cock pheasant eating what is thrown out but we haven't seen the hen pheasant for a long time. The bird bath is filled every day and this morning the frost had to be removed. The pigeons make an awful mess of the water. They bathe regularly and leave a scum over the surface. Recently we had two jays fighting furiously and suddenly they both took off together like a Harrier Jump Jet! One of our near neighbours has had four quite small hedgehogs in the garden and they have been having dishes of cat meat every The worry is will they have reached their proper weight before hibernating? A heron has been visiting our pond but he must be so disappointed because there are no fish in there. The blue tits have been inspecting the bird boxes; perhaps they are turning them into winter accommodation!
