As they were from outside the area they were unable to update us on items raised at our last meeting, and had no knowledge of local matters. We have received a letter from Lichfield Council that indicates that they will be retaining approx £700.00 from whatever precept we set. This means we will have to increase our precept by this amount just to stand still. The neighbourhood meeting held at the Quinney Hall on Wed 22nd January, was attended by County Councillor David Smith, who explained the concept and procedures required to do a neighbourhood plan. Also in attendance were district councillors Brian Yeates, Bourne Vale, and David Salter, Shenstone. Our speaker was Peter Coxhead and he took us on a journey into Sutton Park with the history, habitats of wildlife, trees and plants all illustrated with many slides, well that was after we managed to find the screen mechanism to show them on. We were told that the area of Sutton Park is larger than the conurbation of Birmingham City, food for thought that this area is almost on our doorstep and perhaps overlooked. We were reminded of the time when it was only the people of Sutton Coldfield who had free entry to the park and for others it was payment on the gates and yet today it is open to all and many people just nip through the park as they rather shorten the drive from one side to the other. The heath land is being allowed to expand and trees are being felled and replanted with more suitable species. We heard all about the ponies who had been brought into the park and it had been anticipated that they would forage for their own food, filling out in the summer and losing weight during the winter months and how when people saw them losing weight and showing their bones in the winter they now bring in food and feed them, which is exactly what is not needed, they are intended to be self sufficient and wild. Sometimes we do these things with kind hearts but in this case not good for wild ponies. Members of the committee are shortly meeting to discuss the programme for the next year May, 2013 to April, 2014 and .I would appreciate a call if you may wish to suggest topics or speakers for the quild, or even offer to come along a speak to us, but we will look forward to making you welcome at our AGM on 10th April, whether you are a member or not, drinks and nibbles will be served after reports and elections. Our next meeting is on Thursday 13th February at 7.30pm in the Village Hall and our speaker will be enlightening us about the Hot Springs and volcanoes of New Zealand, and interesting place on the other side of the world.
