Bird update (Janet Clarke)

At long last the small birds have returned and are visiting our feed stations and we are now buying more seeds, peanuts and fat balls. They are such a welcome sight. Bad weather and shortage of food during the summer resulted in the decline in numbers, many nests being abandoned. So far we have seen blue tits, long tailed tits, great tits, coal tits, chaffinches and goldfinches. The lesser spotted woodpecker puts in an appearance now and again as does the nuthatch. Our regulars are the robin, blackbird, starling and sparrow. The starlings are always fighting for room in the bird bath. We have a very fat cock and hen pheasant gleaning under the seed containers and two pigeons have been fighting and cooing (surely it's too early in the year for that sort of behaviour)! We had a fleeting visit from around ten+ fieldfares in the horses' field, all very busy feeding. They are similar in size to a thrush and they live in communities. These are migrant, winter visitors on their way to Scandinavia and I was very lucky to notice them because by the time I had fetched the binoculars they had left. We have had to reposition one of our bird tables as it was in the direct flight path of a bird of prey, consequently no birds were eating there, but they are now back and feeding well.

My grateful thanks to those readers who sent cards or emails thanking me for my time as editor - these were greatly appreciated, as was my basket of flowers, roses and freesias, presented to me at Tony's Presentation Evening."
