You may have seen John's email about the notices of a quarry exhibition in Hints Village Hall on Tuesday 6th Jan between 3 and 8pm. Tony Lloyd has put them up on behalf of the Parish Council who have been invited to a preview. We understand that it is to advise the community about their proposed extensions to the quarry workings. The Parish Council have also been consulted on a proposed road alteration to the junction of the A453 Tamworth Road and the B4151 Slade Road. This is the turning for Mere Green/Four Oaks at Canwell. Their proposal is to alter the junction to prevent any right hand turns. This means anyone coming from Mile Oak would have to go around Bassetts Pole island and come back to enter Slade Road and the only exit out of Slade Road would be towards Mile Oak. They also propose to extend the central reservation to prevent any U-turns at the end of the dual carriageway.

On the plus side the Council have finally got the highways to address the flooding in London Road Canwell. We are also setting up a meeting with highways to point out some issues that residents have in School Lane Hints. Should anyone have comments on any of the above please speak to a Parish Councillor or attend the next Parish Council meeting on 13th Jan at 7.30pm in Hints Village Hall.
