Cycling for Air Ambulance (Jonathan Standring)

On the 21st of July a group of engineers from Triumph motorcycles (including myself) will be subjecting ourselves to the torture of cycling 350 miles in 3 days, oh, and in that 350 miles we will be climbing more than 3/4 the height of Everest or 7400 metres (24280 feet) over some of the highest and steepest mountain road passes in England. The first day starts at Whitehaven, crossing the Lake District to Lancaster. Day 2 crosses over the forest of Bowland then across the Pennines to Northallerton and the final day shall see us crossing the North York Moors and finishing in Scarborough. Obviously this is not all for joy but to raise funds in supporting the Air Ambulance. The Air Ambulance performs on average six life saving operations each day with the life of a horse rider saved every 3 days and the life of a child saved every four days. It would appear that they did encounter a problem with a resident in School Lane and left that task unfinished. We would ask that should they park their truck or erect signs that may cause a problem, please discuss it with the workmen in a pleasant manner and not confrontational. In Canwell there has been evidence that uninvited persons have been visiting properties during the night. No actual reports of damage or missing items have been reported but things have mysteriously moved, apparently by their own efforts. Keep cars and property secure, especially at night. HS2 have advised us that preparatory work for the line has now started. This should not cause any disruption to the community and all landowners will have prior notification. The Parish field, at the rear of Footsteps Nursery in Slade Road, is now being mowed on a regular basis and is available for any resident to use during daylight hours. Next parish council meeting is on July 11th in Hints Village Hall at 7.30pm. There is an HS2 meeting in Stafford earlier in the evening of our parish council meeting so it has been decided to start our meeting later so that the rep from us can get back and give a report. Due to Staffordshire County Council holding an HS2 meeting in Stafford on July 17th we have decided to delay the Parish Council meeting to 8 o'clock so that our representative can get back to Hints to give us a report.
