Bird Update (Janet Clarke)

For the third time we've had to move a feeding station. The sparrow hawk is very cunning and persistent and I think the birds are getting really confused; they will soon need a sat-nav to find the seeds! Rare visitors recently to the seed containers have been two Lesser Redpolls (typical small finch). We've only seen them twice, so we were in the right place at the right time. Do look in your bird books - they are quite colourful and very similar to the Linnet. We have several cock and hen pheasants wandering about and I keep searching to see whether they have a nest under any of the shrubs - no sign so far. The swallows are back with us, always a very welcome sight and are busy inspecting their old nests. Fortunately the few showers should provide them with the necessary mud to either repair their old nests or extend them. The appearance of the butterflies and bees gives us a good feeling. We thought our swan had returned recently but it turned out to be a goose wandering across the field!

Parish Council (Geoff Kynaston)

At the Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 14th May there were five councillors present, four members of the public and the parish clerk. Geoff Kynaston was reelected as chairman and representative on The Parish forum and HS2 consultation forum. Ann Outen as Hints Village Hall Representative, Ashley Yeates as Quiney Hall representative. A further donation of £250.00 was awarded to the action against HS2 committee. Two members of the public raised items of concern that had previously been addressed. The one was a seasonal subject that was recorded to raise again later in the year. We were able to produce copies of e-mails from Lichfield District Council showing that the effluent problem has supposedly been dealt with although there are still concerns about overflow on the public footpath. We have been asked to monitor it. There is to be an extra-ordinary meeting at Quinney Hall on 4th June just to sign off the accounts before audit. The next full council meeting will be at 7.30pm on July 9th at Quinney Hall.
