The speaker on this occasion was Tom Marshall and we were entertained with slides and beautiful scenery and much laughter, 'on our bikes' as we travelled down the country, a few years ago, when he had undertaken the journey over a period of nine days to raise funds for Wild Life Fund. It became apparent that journeys are usually taken the opposite way round by starting at Land's End, due apparently to prevailing winds, but Tom had not been aware of this when he planned his route. The train journey from the Midlands up to Wick took many hours and then after a night at the hotel at John O'Groats the journey began down through Scotland with around 100 miles each day to cover the journey in the time allowed. The bike was loaded down with a sleeping bag etc. but not much in the way of a pump for the tyres and repair kit. It would seem very little money for accommodation, and a cash card that got damaged.

Sleeping on the edge of a loch in the open air in Scotland meant attracting all the local midges. Sleeping in barns was much less of a worry but bunk beds with straw mattresses was interesting as was finding a friend on the route to spend the night and dry out clothes.

The bike stood up the journey but with no spanner etc., the saddle became a problem and one of our members remembered having a bike like the one Tom had used for his journey, but this then ended safely at Land's End but just an hour too late for the lift back home that he had been promised. An excellent meeting.
