A BLAST FROM THE PAST continued (Janet Clarke)

In November 1990 the new curate for Mile Oak and Hints will be the Rev. David Anderson. He and his wife, Marianne, will be coming from Cardiff.

Licensing will take place on 13rh December, probably at St. Barnabas, Mile Oak. Also in the November newsletter a "Conker" match will be held on 9th November.

This proved to be a big draw, although suspicions were raised concerning the "doctoring" of a conker which refused to shatter. The date of a Christmas Fayre was publicised in the December newsletter. The construction of a stage was high on the Village Hall Committee meeting agenda, following the merest whisper of a "Show" in the wings. Rumours that a certain Robert Spurrier fancies himself as a budding Pavorotti and others see Peter Edwards as another John Travolta. What other talent might there be in the village? Bird update (Janet Clarke)

Very, very slowly the birds are returning to the seed and nut containers. We have numerous blue tits, long tailed tits and coal tits. The chaffinches are slowly returning and the other morning, perched high in a tree, there was one singing at the top of his voice and this was wonderful to hear and is hopefully a sign that spring is coming.

(Could he be telling us that the rest of them are on their way)? We were very pleased to see a greenfinch at the seed container, he's the first we have seen so far. We are hearing more bird song now, especially when the sun is shining and the weather is slightly warmer. A regular visitor to the nuts is the greater spotted woodpecker who is remarkably clean - could be the torrential rain that has smartened his feathers! Two robins were seen recently having a dispute, probably concerning territorial rights! We have yet again re-sited two feeding stations, hoping to fool the

sparrow hawk - I'm sure we shall succeed soon. One of our new bird boxes was being inspected a few days ago by a blue tit; hope it meets with his/her approval. It is lovely to see so many hazel catkins in the hedgerows and judging by the number of molehills everywhere, "the little gentlemen in black velvet" have been extremely busy. A Red Kite has been sighted over Bourne Brook being chased by several crows. As far as we know this large bird has not been seen in this area before.

Garden Guild (Maureen Casson)

Once again an excellent meeting of members took place in the Village Hall on Thursday 13th February when we welcomed our Speaker Roger Hailwood. We were taken on a journey to the other side of the world as we visited, with slides, a journey around North Island in New Zealand. We saw beautiful scenes of mountains and lakes, and enjoyed pictures of Roger and family walking on the boardwalk over the delicate surfaces that had been formed from volcanic ash and are only just beginning to produce heathers and small flowers and visiting the snow capped mountains.

Mud and hot springs gave us much food for thought as did the visit to a Maori village with much showing of tongues and 'rubber' like faces and we received instruction of how the 'skirts' were made from flax. A most enjoyable evening, and thank you to Anne and Chris for serving refreshments.

Our March meeting, on the second Thursday, will be rather different and may even be interactive as we will be 'bodging' it was unfortunate that the bodger had to cancel at the last minute in 2013, but on that occasion we enjoyed willow weaving, so we are really looking forward to finding out about 'bodging' In charge of the refreshments on this occasion will be Paul and Joan.
