Robert had travelled to many parts of Staffordshire, Warwickshire and Worcestershire to enjoy the individual interpretations of dressing the wells with the many different themes. A lot of hard work goes into the design and planning of each well and then the soaking of the flower boards which are then marked out and packed with clay and the flowers and leaves are then inserted into the clay separately which seems to be a time when many hands make light work over several days. Some of our members had visited various well dressings and one of the earliest is held at Tissington. Robert is involved with the designing of the wells in his village and he showed to us many of the previous designs and old photographs. Our next meeting will be on Thursday 8th March at the usual time of 7.30pm in the Village Hall when our speaker will be David Howell with a talk titled -Welcome to Spring - and I feel sure we will all be looking forward hopefully to the warmer weather but the gardening season is already getting underway with the appearance of snowdrops and the budding of daffodils.
