#### A welcome to spring (Janet Clarke)

Way back in January we were all wishing the month away and here we are almost into May. This beautiful sun lifts the spirits and the blossom on so many trees and shrubs is a wonderful sight. Long may it last. We're hoping now that all the ladybirds that have hibernated in our bedroom windows for several months will find their way outside. Very early in the year the field fares paid us a very fleeting visit. The birds are out in full force now on the seed and nut containers. There are chaffinches, robins, blue tits and coal tits, sparrows, greenfinches, goldfinches, starlings and one bird which appeared recently is a Reed-Bunting. Haven't seen one before so had to consult my bird book. It is sparrow-size, perhaps slightly larger, with characteristic black and white head-pattern (male) and white outer tail feathers. Just hope there is a female for him. So much seed is ejected by many of the birds but George, the pheasant, is always around to clear these up. Needless to say we have far too many pigeons and magpies. We've also had a Jay on the seed container, struggling to hang on to the bottom. This proved to be most difficult so he changed his tactics and attacked the container from the top, thus stopping it from swinging about. Very clever! We've seen the green woodpecker only once; a case of being in the right place at the right time. Until recently, three moor hens have been on our front lawns. We've had what we think were hedgehog hibernation quarters; purposely built piles of leaves. If we're very lucky we might see them late in the evenings, but more often than not, there is 'evidence' of their presence on the lawns.
