We saw woodland views over the 100 acres of parkland and the replanting of the lawns adjacent to the hall. Unfortunately just after these lawns were planted someone had driven a car over them and then they had to be re-levelled. We saw pictures of the formal gardens and flower beds. An excellent and informative evening, learning more of something, which is so local to our village.
