Parish Council (Geoff Kynaston)

The council have now purchased their own computer and associated equipment with the central government grant they gave us. We have nominated a company to set up our own dedicated web site which should be up and running in November. We had a visit to Hints Quarry in September and they updated us on their restoration programme and future guarrying plans. Some renovation works have been done to the main gates to the parish field at Canwell. The field has recently been mowed and the hedges cut. Parishioners are reminded that the field is available for recreation purposes to all residents during daylight hours. Canwell residents are still concerned about the no right hand turn at the Slade Road/Tamworth road junction, and Staffordshire Highway's reluctance to engage with their concerns. Our next parish council meeting will be on 8th November at 7.30pm in Ouinney Hall Canwell. Members of the public are welcome to attend and raise any relevant points concerning the parish during the fifteen minute public consultation period.
