## Parish Council (Geoff Kynaston)

At the Parish Council meeting held on 9<sup>th</sup> Sept, Simon Clarke was co-opted to take the place of Louise Baines who resigned having moved out of the area. Several members of the community were present and expressed their concern about the amount of traffic using Brockhurst Lane. A council visit is to be arranged with the quarry to raise reinstatement issues and the apparent closure of footpaths. Grants were agreed to both parish churches to go towards the upkeep of the grave yards. The promised visit of the neighbourhood highway team did not materialise again. The idea of this team is to undergo minor roadwork tasks such as cutting back overhanging vegetation and clearing gutters. Their next scheduled visit is supposedly November. # Autumn Fete and Scarecrow Festival (Elaine Clarke)

The inaugural Hints Village Autumn Fete and Scarecrow Festival on Sunday. 21st September was a resounding success with all visitors having a great time and of course the weather was very kind to us! The event was a welcome and essential fundraiser for both the Church and Village Hall to replace the 'Open Gardens Event', which ran successfully for many years and always raised a lot of money for the village. The atmosphere throughout the day was superb, with many visitors commenting on how much they had enjoyed it and the first car park was full some 20 minutes after opening time! With 53 fabulous Scarecrows, a classic car display, lots of stalls and an array of amazing flower arrangements at the Flower Festival in the Church there was loads to see and do for only £3.00/car entrance fee. Much needed refreshment was on offer in the Village Hall with a BBO outside and other refreshments on offer in the '1940's themed' hall with service by some fabulously dressed land girls! With queues there for most of the day, the catering was a great success and a huge thank you to all involved whether cooking, clearing up, manning stalls, making scarecrows or doing flower arrangements - everyone played a huge part in making it such a great fundraiser! Jenny Clarke scooped the prize for the 'Best Scarecrow' with her excellent 'Queen on Horseback' jumping over their garden wall, although it is very fair to say the standard of all of the scarecrows was excellent. The day culminated with a very well attended Harvest Festival Service in the Church followed by a Harvest Supper in The Village Hall organised by Val Edwards with help from others and this rounded the day off very well. We all now need to get our thinking caps on for scarecrow ideas as it has been decided that we should hold another event at a similar time again next year!
