## Parish Council (Geoff Kynaston)

Sara Mallen, Staffordshire County Council liaison officer on HS2, will be holding an open fourum in Hints village hall on Thursday 30th November between 5-7pm. All members of the parish and those affected by this project are invited to attend. Note this is Staffordshire County Council not HS2 themselves. Now is your chance to try and obtain some information. The parish council recently visited Hints Quarry to get an update on progress and renovation. Tarmac side of the guarry is well in hand with their renovation schedule. Hopwas guarry on the other hand, still under Cemex control, are way behind. They have apparently completed the contouring but are still awaiting final decisions on the plans for renovation. We have eventually obtained a copy of the road safety audit that highways did on the "no right hand turn" at the A453 Sutton Road/B4151 Slade Road. This was done in April and we had to twist Highways arm to get a copy. It is very superficial quoting only two minor accidents since the alteration. I have a record of another two that I had emailed highways about and photographs of a third. We are not impressed with their report and have advised them of their omissions.
