They advised that they were recently taken over by an Irish company, CRM. Our request for funding for a village defibrillator, although hopeful, has been delayed because of the takeover. On another front we have secured partial funding from County Councillor David Smith. The Parish Field is being maintained on a regular basis and is available to all parishioners. It is also available for private hire on a pre bookable basis. A representative from the neighbourhood highway team recently toured the parish and various general tidying up jobs were discussed. Lichfield planning has differed a decision on the Country Pursuits Planning application at Weeford. Weeford Parish Council have had an independent noise survey done and planning require more time to consider the implications. Next parish council meeting in Hints on 8<sup>th</sup> September at 7.30pm.
