St Bartholomew's Church (Lloyd Ansermoz)

It was great to be able to get together again as a community at our Bingo night on the 5^{th} of March in our Village Hall. Thank you so much to everybody for helping us raise just over £300.00 which we immediately donated to the British Red Cross Ukraine appeal knowing that every penny we have donated goes straight to those that need it. A big thank you also to Jane for organising the event and being a great Bingo caller!

Our services in April are set out at the back page which include our **Morning Easter Day Service on the 17th April at 10.00 am** which is a very special time for us and our Church so please feel free to join us, you will as always be made very welcome.

We continue through the Lent season in our church with thoughts and prayers for those affected by the War in Ukraine which has triggered the largest war-related migration of people since the Balkan War of the 1990s and the UN estimates that 12 million people inside Ukraine will need relief and protection, while more than 4 million Ukrainian refugees may need protection and assistance in neighbouring countries in coming months. Most of those fleeing are women and children, the elderly and the sick and most are leaving with the few possessions that they can carry. Those left behind face an uncertain future. People are living with no food, no water, no heat, no electricity. They need urgent respite from violence and humanitarian assistance. Despite the heart wrenching stories and distressing pictures coming out of Ukraine, there are practical ways in which we can all help to show solidarity and support with those most affected. There are a lot of appeals out there and some of us are confused with how to make a donation which will reach those in need directly so please contact me if you feel you would like to help further knowing that all that you give will go directly to where it is needed through the British Red Cross.

At our **Evening Prayer service on Sunday 3rd April at 6.20 pm** we will continue in prayer for the Ukraine. For those who may not be able to make our service we set out one our prayers for you to consider:

God of peace and justice, we pray for the people of Ukraine today.

We pray for peace and the laying down of weapons.

We pray for all those who fear for tomorrow,

that your Spirit of comfort would draw near to them.

We pray for those with power over war or peace, for wisdom, discernment and compassion

to guide their decisions.

Above all, we pray for all your precious children, at risk and in fear, that you would hold and protect them.

We pray in the name of Jesus, the Prince of Peace.

Parish Council (Geoff Kynaston)

Lichfield District Council are looking at revising parish council boundaries. There is a public consultation that can be accessed on line,

https://www.lichfielddc.gov.uk/custom/consultations/view/51. The main implication is that they are looking to merge smaller parish councils. Consultation ends on 25th April. Your views are important. Please have your say, do it now, don't put it off! Slow painted signs on the road surface in School Lane have been approved by highways and have been scheduled for the 2022/2023 financial period. Shenstone Surgery is reopening on 4th April between the hours of 9am and 1pm for pre booked appointments only. We have received an ecological report from HS2 concerning Canwell parish field. Unfortunately the trees offered were not considered suitable. They were mainly forest type conifers. HS2 have advised overnight lane closers on the A5 bypass. Their previous works were postponed. New times in April, Westbound Fri 1st/Sat 2nd and Eastbound Sun 3rd/Mon4th all between the hours of 9pm to 5.30am. I currently have 5 highways reports concerning potholes and blocked gullies in London Road Canwell all dated 30th Jan 22. ! in Sep 21 concerning a payement and the latest concerning a water leak in London Road. This leak was first reported to South Staffs Water, they passed it on to Seven Trent on 28th Feb. As nothing appeared to have been done I contacted Seven Trent, long wait on phone, they say it is a highways problem who say it is not a priority and will get around to it eventually, report 4273990. I have included this Canwell item as it was suggested at the last Parish Council meeting that I don't do anything for Canwell! Next parish council meeting on May 10th in Hints Hall. This will be the annual meeting followed by a normal Parish Council meeting.
