We were shown maps of the country and enlightened about the Japanese occupation during World War Two and the forced marches killing off the prisoners and were aware of the war crimes committed as we noted the many names on the war memorial. From the devastation left in this country after the second World War, the modern cities have grown from the ruins of the bombing and the countryside scenery was enchanting and atmospheric due to the climate with rain forests and the orchids are gathered and sent to Kew gardens for identification and many new species are sent to them to enlarge the orchid collection there, the beauty and colours of these plants was clearly shown in the pictures. We also enjoyed seeing the animals in their own habitat and Proboscis monkeys with their families was entertaining.
