Parish Council (Geoff Kynaston)

HS2 have notified the Parish Council of two further restrictions in our area in Bangley Lane between Mon 29th Nov and Fri 3rd Dec they will be doing preparatory work. Marshalls will be stationed at either end of Bangley and will be in radio contact with each other. Access to all properties will be maintained throughout the operation. One lane on the west bound A5 bypass will be closed between 8th and 21st Dec for preparatory work on the proposed under bridge. At the last parish council meeting we discussed the painting of "slow" signs on the surface of School Lane. It is proposed to put one as the road levels out by the bungalows and another somewhere near The Villa/Lady Walk junction. The idea is to emphasise to drivers the need for caution in the village narrow lanes. Residents are asked to convey their thoughts to a councillor before we proceed as there has been some negative comments made. The suggestion that we plant a tree to commemorate the Queen's platinum anniversary will be discussed at our next council meeting. The parish field in Canwell would be one suitable place but suggestions are invited for a suitable location in Hints as the parish council do not own any land in Hints.

Advent is here

December and Christmas time each year for many is a real opportunity for family and friends to be together and last year this was a huge challenge for us all when restrictions were in place. Our Church of St Bartholomew's are making the most of this year and we are really looking forward to enjoying our services in December and hope that you too will be able to ioin us in our celebrations with some great services including our Voices Entwined Choir Evening with music and songs from all genres and eras on the 11th and also our candle lit Carol Service on the 19th both followed up with getting together in our Village Hall. For Christians all over the world Advent is the probably the most important and sacred time in the Christian Calendar, The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word adventus, meaning "coming," which is a translation of the Greek word Parousia. Scholars believe that during the 4th and 5th centuries in Spain and Gaul, Advent was a season of preparation for the baptism of new Christians at the January feast of Epiphany, the celebration of God's incarnation represented by the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus, His baptism in the Jordan River by John the Baptist and his first miracle at Cana. During this season of preparation, Christians would spend 40 days in penance, prayer, and fasting to prepare for this celebration so originally, there was little connection between Advent and Christmas, Today, the season of Advent lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas, Advent begins on Sunday that falls between November 27th and December 3rd each year. Advent 2021 begins on Sunday, November 28th, and ends on Friday, December 24th.

A Prayer for the start of Advent

Father, let your hope arise in our hearts! Lift our eyes up to see that you alone are where our hope comes from. Help us to shake off the anxiety, discouragements, and distractions that have filled this year. May we pause to remember that we have **hope** in you. You know the end of our stories, and we give thanks because you have promised that it will be a victorious ending. Give us the grace we need to wrap up this year joyfully. We invite your Spirit into this beautiful Advent season. Renew our sense of holy anticipation! Let us be those who are waiting eagerly for Jesus to come again. More than anything, we ask that you be glorified in this season of expectation.
