# Commonwealth War Graves Commission in Hints Churchyard (Simon Clarke)

## (Ed - sorry, forgot to put this in the December newsletter!)

This Commonwealth War Graves Commission memorial in St Bartholomew's churchyard remembers **Edward George Keeling** who died at Hints on 23 March 1919, aged 30, a victim of the cataclysmic international flu epidemic. Born at Market Drayton in Shropshire in 1888, he does not appear on the 1911 Census by the fact that he had become a professional soldier in the Yorkshire Regiment, serving in India. When the Great War began he was transferred to the 407<sup>th</sup> Agricultural Company, Labour Corps, which may explain why he came to be living in Hints when he died. In early 1916 he married Ada Rawlins at Tamworth, who was born at Mile Oak. War Office records show that she was resident at The Hill, Elford at the time of his death. To mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this soldier's death, it may be fitting to hold a special service at the end of March next year. If anyone could find out more information about the soldiers' family it would be much appreciated.

It is now over three months since we were promised the gullies would be jetted out to alleviate the flooding problems. Still no action!
