Good News regarding YOUR Village Hall - Now that the government has relaxed the restrictions regarding public access to licensed premises, we are preparing to re-open the Village Hall. There are certain changes and considerations that have to be taken into account and to ensure we are in a position to fully comply with these new regulations it is our intention to reopen on 7th August. We will keep you advised of the developments in this respect.

## Re-opening of St Bartholomew's Church (Fr Jason)

The church at Hints can be open on Sundays only, commencing on 5<sup>th</sup> July, for private individual prayer only. Father Jason will come to the church sometime this week to organise the church layout in respect of reopening for private prayer. I will inform in due course when the church will be open again for services (said, no singing). This is likely to be in mid-July (most likely the third week for an evening service). However, until all needs across the three parishes (as Hints is just one part of a mosaic of considerations) have been considered, no firm decision has been made at present.

#### The Ford

The amount of vehicles parking around the Ford is increasing both during the day and evenings. It is making it difficult for farm vehicles to pass and the amount of noise and rubbish being left is not acceptable.
