Parish Council (Geoff Kynaston)

Notice of road closers that might affect residents. HS2 are doing local environmental works, and will be putting temporary traffic lights on Watling Street, by Bucks Head farm to enable heavy machinery to cross the road during the works. Footpaths no 5, 13 and 14 will also be affected. The A38 will be closed to all traffic in both directions between Weeford Island and Basset's Pole during the hours of 8pm and 5am between December 2nd and 5th. This is to facilitate works on the average speed cameras. As a word of caution, I know that these are on line and current, with infra-red for night times.
