St Bartholomew's Church Hints (Lloyd Ansermoz, Churchwarden)

Dear Friends and Neighbours - we need your help. We are holding an open meeting in the Hints Village Hall on the Evening of Thursday 31st October at 7.00 pm and we would very much welcome your attendance. Our Village Church and Churchyard is in danger of being closed down and left unattended and abandoned due to the lack of consistent funds. Closure is imminent and could be as soon as December this year. The Church doors and gates are at risk of being locked for good unless we are able to obtain more consistent funding. Our beautiful and graceful Church was built in 1883 and is still in relatively good order for its age but to keep the Church open and in good order we currently have to find just over £1,000 per month. Unfortunately the current income is below this and therefore current funds are running out rapidly. Our Church is an integral part of our Village structure and beauty so closing it down will result in dilapidation and inevitably a blot on the landscape with gates and doors chained and padlocked and windows boarded up which will also attract all types of unsavoury and unwanted characters into the village. (Lead theft and break ins are common to unattended Churches). The Grounds and Churchyard will be become abandoned and overgrown very quickly. Who wants to see that in our village of natural beauty? But all is not lost and you can help by supporting us to keep our church open and your ideas and suggestions would be very much appreciated.
